State Senator Chris Johnson has announced the first local Angel training that will include procedures and other details of Lincoln County's own Recovery Collaborative. Eric Haram, the Executive Director of Outpatient Treatment at MidCoast Hospital's Addiction Resource Center (ARC) will lead the training along with many of the steering committee representing police departments, and sheriff's office, LincolnHealth and YMCA.

Law enforcement officers will also be receiving training later in the week. With the signed agreement in hand the steering committee has been working on processes, documentation, and planning training so that we can begin accepting individuals seeking help with addiction at all our police departments in the county.
